NOVEMBER 30 - FEAST OF SAINT ANDREW, APOSTLE: Andrew came from Bethsaida in Galilee and, like his father and his brother Simon, he was a fisherman. A disciple of John the Baptist, Andrew was present at Jesus' baptism. When John stated, "Behold the Lamb of God", Andrew understood and followed Jesus. Going to his brother Simon Peter, Andrew told him that he had found the Messiah. Thus Andrew is known as the first disciple of Jesus. Later, when Jesus chose his apostles, Andrew was among the Twelve. He is a patron saint of Scotland and Russia, of the Greek Church, and of the fishing industry. The cross of Saint Andrew, which represents Scotland on the Union Jack, was first associated with Andrew in the tenth century.

DIOCESAN REFUGEE PROGRAM

Because of the generosity of the People of the Diocese, a second refugee family has arrived in Newfoundland. Salah, Amina, and their two children, Ahmed and Madlin have reached Clarenville as refugees from Syria. The new family is currently setting up a home, getting organized for English language instruction, meeting different organizations and groups, preparing for winter in Newfoundland, etc. The new family is grateful for our sponsorship and have already met the congregation of Our Lady of Fatima, Clarenville. Thank you to all who have assisted in their sponsorship and are helping with their resettlement into Clarenville. More information will be provided later.

Family Prayer: In the family, through the faith and love of parents, children first experience the love of Jesus in their lives. Through their parents, especially through prayer, children learn to know and love God. Parents can pray with little ones, and read Bible stories to them, and teach little ones to bless themselves. The parents can also teach their children prayers like the 'Our Father' and the "Hail Mary". Meal time is also an important time to ask God's blessing and to give thanks. It would be a beautiful blessing for families to spend some time each day, or each evening, praying together and asking God's help.

Gluten Free Hosts: Some people have an alergy which can be triggered by wheat. As you know, the Sacred Hosts which we receive in Holy Communion are made from wheat. Recently, we have purchased a small number of gluten free hosts. If you would like to receive Holy Communion with a gluten free host, we ask you to please phone the parish office at 538-3106, so we can be prepared beforehand.

CHRIST THE KING

Today, on the last Sunday of this liturgical year (Year A), we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King. Today's focus is the end-times when Christ the King will "sit on the throne of his glory". Christ, the King, in separating people one from another, is likened to a shepherd who "separates the sheep from the goats". The image of shepherd reminds us that the mission of Jesus was not one of power but of service, and we who are involved in carrying on Christ's mission are, as the Gospel suggests, to put ourselves at the service of others—feeding the hungry, giving drink to the thirsty, welcoming the stranger, clothing the naked, caring for the sick, and visiting the imprisoned. As we await the beginning of the Advent Season next Sunday, and as we anticipate the birth of Jesus, our 'Shepherd-King' at Christmas, today is a good time to commit to living like the Lord Jesus who came to serve, and not be served, thus building up the Kingdom of God until we are called to eternal life. Then, "freed from the corruption of sin and death", the risen people of God will rejoice in a new heaven and a new earth and shall sing God's glory with every creature (Eucharistic Prayer IV).
