AUGUST 27 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT MONICA: Monica. concerned about her son Augustine who had abandoned his Christian faith, devoted herself in earnest to his conversion. After some years, Augustine, influenced by the great sermons of Bishop Ambrose, and without doubt, due to the prayers of his mother, returned to his faith. In his famous book, Confessions, Augustine describes a spiritual experience which he and his mother shared near the end of her life, and he always remembered his mother's efforts on his behalf. Monica is a patroness of mothers.

AUGUST 28 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT AUGUSTINE, BISHOP,

DOCTOR: Augustine (354-430), born in North Africa, abandoned his Christian faith but later embraced it, thanks to the prayers of his mother Monica and the influence of the great Bishop Ambrose whose sermons convinced him of the truth of Christianity. At Easter 387, Augustine was baptized by Ambrose. In 391 he was ordained a Priest, and in 396 he became Bishop of Hippo, where he spent the rest of his life, working and writing. His intelligence and pastoral concern shaped the thought of Western Christianity and guided the Church for over a thousand years. Augustine is one of the greatest Fathers of the Church.

AUGUST 29 - MEMORIAL OF THE PASSION OF SAINT JOHN

THE BAPTIST: After John's birth, his father Zechariah spoke Isaiah's prophecy ('Benedictus'), saying that his son John would prepare the way of the Lord. John did just that; he traveled around the countryside, preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. In his zeal, John reproved Herod for living with his brother's wife, Herodias, so Herod had John imprisoned. When Salome, the daughter of Herodias, impressed Herod with her dancing, Herod promised her whatever she wanted. Salome consulted her mother who told her to ask for the head of John the Baptist on a platter. Herod could not refuse to honour his oath. The news of John's death soon reached his disciples who came for the body and laid it in a tomb.

MANDATORY WEARING OF FACEMASKS IN PUBLIC PLACES

Effective Monday, August 24th, Government is making it madatory that masks be worn in all public places.

Therefore, masks must be worn by everyone entering, and moving around in church. When you are seated and are physically distanced (6 ft apart), you can remove your mask until you leave your seat at Communion time and then again when leaving the church.
