Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

In today's Gospel, Jesus uses three parables to teach us about the Kingdom of God. The Parable of the Weeds among the Wheat helps us to realize that only the Lord of the harvest – whose grace is at work in a hidden way in every human heart – can sort out the good from the bad when all is gathered at the end. We who are blessed with the gift of faith are challenged to prepare for the final harvest by becoming an exemplary crop ourselves. The Parable of the Mustard Seed demonstrates the importance of faith in believing that God's Kingdom, with its humble beginnings within the boundaries of Palestine some 2000 years ago, continues to grow worldwide..The Parable of the Yeast tells of the hidden designs of God being worked out in history, resulting in good fruit as a result of God working in many people. All three parables have a clear message for the Church of today, helping us to understand truths about the Kingdom of God and what the coming of God's life-giving reign should mean to us.

PARISHIONERS MUST REGISTER TO ATTEND MASS:

Call 538-3106 between 9:00 a.m. -2:00 p.m. Wed-Fri. You <u>MUST</u> register <u>EVERY</u> week if you are attending. Capacity is limited to adhere to Government Directives. Only those who register for Mass can be permitted in.

Mass Attendance Screening Questionnaire:

Copy will be attached to the bulletin. If you are registered to attend mass that day, you will answer questions at home, prior to attending mass. You will **not need** to hand a copy in to the parish.

WHEN YOU ARRIVE:

Please check with ushers at the church entrance to have names checked on the registration list, use hand sanitizers that are placed near the church entrances and be escorted to designated pews to ensure proper physical distancing.

Please adhere to the markers in the aisle and pews and maintain green lines on the floor to ensure safe distancing during Communion.

Collection basket will be placed at the back of the church for parishioners' offerings.

THE DISTRIBUTION OF THE HOLY COMMUNION:

Those who desire to receive Holy Communion, may do so at the appropriate moment, but those who wish to remain in their places may do so.

Holy Communion may not be received on the tongue, nor may it be received in the hand if a member of the faithful is wearing gloves.

People come forward and receive communion in the hand. Communion on the tongue is not permitted at this time.
