<u>MAY 20 - VICTORIA DAY:</u> This year Victoria Day is celebrated on Monday, May 20. The birthday (May 24, 1819) of Queen Victoria has been celebrated as a holiday in Canada West (now Ontario) since 1845; it became a national holiday in 1901, the year that Queen Victoria died. Although the Sovereign changed along the years, the day of her/his birthday celebration remained. In 1952, it was established on the Monday preceding May 25. Today it is appropriate to offer prayers for the Queen, for Canada, and for justice and peace in the world.

May 21 - Memorial of Saint Christopher Magallanes, Priest, Martyr,

and Companions: Born in Mexico in 1869, Christopher Magallanes entered the seminary at age 19. After ordination, he and his companions worked with the poor and the indigenous people of Mexico. In the 1920's, the anti-Catholic government in Mexico closed all seminaries and Father Christopher started his own seminary, but it was soon forced to close. He opened another, and another, and finally conducted classes in private homes. He was arrested on May 21, 1927, while on his way to celebrate Mass and was falsely accused of promoting armed rebellion. He was executed four days later, along with 21 diocesan priests and 3 laymen. Before his martyrdom, he forgave his executioners. He was canonized by Pope John Paul II in 2000.

MAY 24 - WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR THE CHURCH IN

CHINA: In May, 2007, Pope Benedict XVI asked that May 24 be observed as a Day of Prayer for the Church in China. The Holy Father chose this day since it is the traditional feast of Our Lady of Help of Christians, who is venerated at the Shrine of Sheshan in Shanghai.

<u>May 25 - Memorial of Saint Gregory VII, Pope:</u> Hildebrand (later Pope Gregory VII) was born in Tuscany about 1023. He was educated at a monastery and was acclaimed Pope in 1073. As Pope Gregory VII, he began an extensive reform of the Church and of its relations with civil authorities, provoking conflict and intrigue. In defending the Church against the threat of secular domination, Gregory made many enemies. He died in exile in 1085.
