October 9 - Memorial of Saint Denis, Bishop, and Companions, Martyrs: Denis was the first bishop of Paris. During a third century persecution, the missionary Denis was preaching in the area now known as Paris when he and two companions suffered martyrdom. Later a chapel was built over their tomb on Montmartre, "the mount of martyrs"; this chapel grew into the great abbey of Saint Denis. Denis is patron saint of France.

October 9 - Memorial of Saint John Leonardi, Priest: John Leonardi, born in 1550 during the Catholic Reformation, was an assistant pharmacist when he decided to study for the priesthood. After ordination in 1572, he worked with the sick and imprisoned in Italy. His way of life soon attracted others and together they decided to form a new congregation, the Clerks Regular of the Mother of God. John also helped establish the forerunner to the Congregation for the Evangelization of Peoples. He died in Rome in 1609, having caught the plague from those he tended.

October 11 - Memorial of Saint John XXIII, Pope: Born in 1881, Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli was ordained a Priest in1904, appointed Bishop in 1925, created a Cardinal in 1953, and elected Pope in 1958, taking the name John XXIII. During his pontificate of less than five years, the world came to see him as an authentic image of the Good Shepherd. Meek and gentle, enterprising and courageous, simple and active, he carried out the corporal and spiritual works of mercy, bestowing on all his fatherly care. He contributed to the Social Magisterium of the Church with his two Encyclicals, *Pacem in Terris* and *Mater et Magistra*, convoked the Roman Synod, established the Commission for the Revision of the Code of Canon Law, and summoned the Second Vatican Council. Known to the faithful as "the good Pope", Pope John XXIII died on June 3,1963, and was canonized on April 27, 2014.

In today 's Gospel we hear The Parable of the Tenants in the Vineyard. In this parable, Jesus tells of a landowner (God) who places his vineyard (God's Kingdom - Israel) in the hands of tenant workers (Israel's religious leaders). The landowner sends his servants (God's prophets) to collect the produce but they are either beaten, rejected, or killed. Finally, the landowner sends his beloved son (Jesus Christ) but the tenants kill him too. Today the vineyard is the Church, the great vineyard that the Lord cultivates and cares for and that is entrusted to us, his servant disciples. Many people, however, continue to reject God's Son and fail to work his vineyard. Yet the Church continues to grow because it is built on a sure foundation, the chief cornerstone – Jesus Christ. This week let us reflect on our part in building up the Church. How are we working the vineyard and producing the fruits of the Kingdom, thus helping it to grow as God desires?
