JUNE 9 - MEMORIAL OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY, MOTHER OF

THE CHURCH: The title honouring Mary as "Mother of the Church" is used "in the texts of spiritual authors as well as in the Magisterium of Popes Benedict XIV and Leo XIII" (Decree of Pope Francis, February 11, 2018). During the Second Vatican Council, the title "Mother of the Church" was bestowed on the Blessed Virgin Mary by Pope Paul VI who declared that "the Mother of God should be further honoured and invoked by the entire Christian people by this tenderest of titles". Most recently, on February 11, 2018, the 160th anniversary of the apparition of the Blessed Virgin Mary at Lourdes, the Holy Father, Pope Francis, decreed that "the Memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church, should be inscribed in the Roman Calendar on the Monday following Pentecost and be now celebrated every year. This celebration will help us to remember that growth in the Christian life must be anchored to the Mystery of the Cross, to the oblation of Christ in the Eucharistic Banquet and the Mother of the Redeemer and Mother of the Redeemed, the Virgin who makes her offering to God". This Memorial takes precedence over other memorials which may fall on the same day.

JUNE 11 - MEMORIAL OF ST. BARNABAS, APOSTLE: Barnabas, a Jew from Cyprus, came to Jerusalem where he joined the early Christian community. The apostles changed his name from Joseph to Barnabas which Saint Luke tells us means 'man of encouragement'. All that we know of Barnabas is recorded by Saint Luke in the *Acts of the Apostles*: he was a good man, full of the Holy Spirit and of faith. It was Barnabas who accepted Paul into the community after his conversion and who was at Paul's side for many years as his partner in evangelizing the Gentiles. Tradition has it that Barnabas was stoned to death in his native Cyprus about the year 61.

JUNE 13 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT ANTHONY OF PADUA, PRIEST,

DOCTOR: Although Anthony came from Portugal, the city of Padua in Italy claims him as its own. Born in 1195, he joined the Canons Regular of Saint Augustine, becoming an accomplished biblical scholar. His contact with some Franciscans who were later martyred inspired him to move to the Franciscans. Illness prevented mission work and he was sent to Italy where, having lived a hidden life, he was ordered to fill in for an absent preacher. The immediate result was the discovery of his great oratorical gifts. This awareness of his special gift for teaching and preaching led Francis to send Anthony to preach and to teach his fellow friars throughout northern Italy. The power of his words converted numerous people. Exhausted and ill, he died at the age of 36, so beloved and revered that he was canonized within the year. Saint Anthony of Padua is often invoked for his help in finding lost objects.

ORDINARY TIME: Ordinary Time encompasses that part of the liturgical year that does not fall within the distinctive seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter. The Catholic Church celebrates two periods of the year as Ordinary Time: the first following the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord and continuing until the Tuesday evening before Ash Wednesday; the second following Pentecost Sunday until the evening before Advent. There are about 33 or 34 Sundays in Ordinary Time, depending on the year. In actuality, however, there are fewer "Sundays in Ordinary Time" because major feasts honouring the Trinity, Corpus Christi, Christ the King, and others replace a particular Sunday in Ordinary Time. It is important to remember that Ordinary Time celebrates "the mystery of Christ in all its aspects". Pope Paul VI, in his Apostolic Letter approving the Roman calendar (February 14, 1969) says, "The reason for the restoration of the liturgical year is to help believers through their faith, hope and love to share more fully in the entire mystery of Christ as it is unfolding throughout the year." The Sundays in Ordinary Time are an important part of this unfolding mystery.
