January 20 - Memorial of Saint Fabian, Pope, Martyr: Fabian became Pope in 236. When a dove settled upon his head, those around him were reminded of the descent of the Holy Spirit on Jesus at his baptism. The event was seen as divine intervention, and Fabian was chosen Pope, reigning for fourteen years. He was martyred during a persecution in 250.

January 20 - Memorial of Saint Sebastian, Martyr: Sebastian was martyred in Rome, probably in the third century, and was buried along the Appian Way in the catacombs. He came from Milan, where he has been venerated since the fourth century. Sebastian is a patron saint of the Pope's Swiss Guard and he is also the patron saint of athletes and soldiers.

JANUARY 21 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT AGNES, VIRGIN, MARTYR:

Agnes was martyred at the age of twelve during a Roman persecution. She has been, over the centuries, a symbol of virginal innocence. She is the most highly honoured of the early Roman virgin martyrs and, since the Middle Ages, has been pictured with a lamb as a symbol of this innocence.

January 22 - Memorial of Saint Vincent, Deacon, Martyr: Vincent was a deacon in Saragossa, Spain, in the third century. Deacons were responsible for the local Church's works of charity and mercy – most often the only form of organized relief – and preaching was often part of this work. Vincent excelled in his duties and became known to the hostile Roman authorities. He was arrested with his Bishop, tortured, imprisoned and killed in 304. Vincent was the first Spanish martyr and is a patron of wine producers, sailors and brickmakers.

JANUARY 24 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT FRANCIS DE SALES, BISHOP,

DOCTOR: Born in 1567, Francis, after obtaining doctorates in both canon and civil law, rejected opportunities for a brilliant career, choosing religious life instead. He was ordained in 1593 and appointed Bishop of Geneva in 1602. He lived a life of austerity and simplicity, sharing his abundance with the poor. In his ministry, he emphasized both the loving kindness of God and the human capacity for love. He was also one of the principal leaders of the Catholic Reformation. Francis died in 1622, was beatified the same year, and was canonized in 1665. He is a Doctor of the Church and patron saint of the deaf, of writers, and of the Catholic press.

SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Today's Gospel, the story of the wedding at Cana, is full of symbolism and deep meaning. Jesus performs his first miracle when he changes the water into wine and we hear these words, "Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory". It is another manifestation or epiphany. The "sign" that most fully reveals Jesus' glory is the shedding of his blood on the cross, and the Eucharistic wine is Jesus' blood, shed for all. Furthermore, the abundance at the wedding symbolizes the abundance we receive at the Eucharistic table, as well as the abundance that will be ours at the great Messianic Banquet. It is no wonder that this story is closely linked with the Eucharist.
