JANUARY 31 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT JOHN BOSCO, PRIEST: John was born in Piedmont, Italy, in 1815. He studied for the Priesthood and was ordained in Turin. After visiting a prison while still a young Priest and seeing the fate of children imprisoned there, he resolved to devote himself to working among disadvantaged boys. He formed the Salesian Society, named after Francis de Sales, and began educating boys of the poor and working classes. Motivated by charity and gentleness, he always treated his students with kindness and dignity. With the help of Saint Mary Mazzarello, he also established the Salesian Sisters (Daughters of Mary, Help of Christians) to do similar work among girls. John Bosco died in 1888 and was canonized in 1934.

FEBRUARY 2 - FEAST OF THE PRESENTATION OF THE LORD:

Today's feast honours both Our Lord and the Blessed Virgin. It commemorates the presentation of Jesus in the temple, which we reflect upon in the Fourth Joyful Mystery of the Rosary, as well as Mary's purification as she re-enters the temple to present her Son to God. The observance of this feast began in fourth century Jerusalem. In the Middle Ages, a tradition began of blessing candles and holding a procession of light on this day. As a result, this feast is also known as "Candlemas", Christ our light has come to us. The Gospel presents this epiphany to us as Jesus is revealed as "a light of revelation to the Gentiles". The challenge for us, as we welcome the light of Christ into our hearts and lives, is to become bright beacons in today's world, radiating the warmth of Christ's light to everyone we meet.

FEBRUARY 2 - WORLD DAY FOR CONSECRATED LIFE: Today is also the "World Day for Consecrated Life". The purpose of this day is "to help the entire Church to esteem ever more greatly the witness of those persons who have chosen to follow Christ by means of the practice of the evangelical counsels", as well as "to be a suitable occasion for consecrated persons to renew their commitment and rekindle the fervour which should inspire their offering of themselves to the Lord" (Saint John Paul II, 1997).

February 3 - Memorial of Saint Blaise, Bishop, Martyr: According to legend, Blaise performed a miraculous cure on a boy who was choking to death and so has long been associated with cures for afflictions of the throat. During the persecution of Licinius in the early fourth century, Blaise, who was an Armenian Bishop, suffered martyrdom. He is the patron of wild animals, wool-combers, and of all who suffer from afflictions of the throat.

February 3 - Memorial of Saint Ansgar, Bishop: Ansgar, who was born near Amiens about 801, was later sent to study at a nearby monastery and became a monk in order to preach to the pagans. He had an extraordinary talent for preaching and converted many to the Christian faith. Known as the Apostle of the North, he died in 865, greatly venerated for his charity and sanctity. Ansgar is a patron of Denmark, Germany, and Iceland.
