**ORDINARY TIME:** Ordinary Time encompasses that part of the liturgical year that does not fall within the distinctive seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter. The Catholic Church celebrates two periods of the year as Ordinary Time: the first following the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord and continuing until the Tuesday evening before Ash Wednesday; the second following Pentecost Sunday until the evening before Advent. There are about 33 or 34 Sundays in Ordinary Time, depending on the year. In actuality, however, there are fewer "Sundays in Ordinary Time" because major feasts honouring the Trinity, Corpus Christi, Christ the King, and others replace a particular Sunday in Ordinary Time. It is important to remember that Ordinary Time celebrates "the mystery of Christ in all its aspects". Pope Paul VI, in his Apostolic Letter approving the Roman calendar (February 14, 1969) says, "The reason for the restoration of the liturgical year is to help believers through their faith, hope and love to share more fully in the entire mystery of Christ as it is unfolding throughout the year." The Sundays in Ordinary Time are an important part of this unfolding mystery. We also may celebrate the parts of Jesus' life that were ordinary, much like our own lives.

*Cremation in the Catholic Church:* Many people are inquiring about cremation in the Church, and some people are choosing to have their body cremated after death. The first thing all must know is that cremation is permitted in the Catholic Church. Some large cities are finding difficulty in obtaining large pieces of ground for new cemeteries and cremation may be a partial solution to this problem. Also, some people die far from home, and the cost of sending home the body in a casket is very expensive compared to sending an urn with a loved ones ashes. Cremation should take place after the funeral Mass. The ashes of the deceased person should be reverently buried or entombed in a place reserved for the burial of the dead. As in life, the body is the temple of the Holy Spirit, so in death the ashes of the deceased person should not be scattered but should be buried in a holy place where we await the resurrection to new life.

## JUNE 5 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT BONIFACE, BISHOP, MARTYR: Boniface was

commissioned by Pope Gregory II to preach to the heathens. He later was made a bishop and received official documents to ensure his protection from pagan rulers. Boniface's work in Germany and in the Frankish Church as missionary, organizer and reformer was outstanding and lasting. He is called the "Apostle of Germany". On June 5, 754, Boniface and 30 companions were killed by non-Christians as Boniface was preparing to confirm more converts.

<u>June 6 - Memorial of Saint Norbert, Bishop:</u> Norbert was born near Xanten (Germany) in 1080. As a young man in minor orders, he lived a life devoted to pleasure until a narrow escape from death in 1115 inspired him to reform his life and become a monk. Irked by his extreme asceticism and his attempts to reform them, his fellow monks denounced him. Resigning his position, Norbert gave away all his worldly goods and went to Rome where Pope Gelasius II granted him permission to preach the Gospel wherever he wished. He became an itinerant preacher in France, was named a Bishop in 1126, and worked in the defence of the rights of the Church against secular powers. Norbert died on this date in 1134.

**JUNE 8 - SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST SACRED HEART OF JESUS:** In the devotion to the Sacred Heart, the heart of Jesus is adored as a symbol of his threefold love: human love, spiritual love, and divine love. In modern times, the image of the Sacred Heart in the home has become a sign that the love of Jesus rules over the family. In 1899, Pope Leo XIII consecrated the world to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

## JUNE 9 - MEMORIAL OF THE IMMACULATE HEART OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY:

The devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary is closely linked with that to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Although popular devotion began in the 17<sup>th</sup> century, it was in 1805 that permission was given for a feast of the Pure Heart of Mary. In 1944 the feast was instituted in the Western Church. Since then, popes have on numerous occasions consecrated the whole world to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Mary's sanctity and her love as the Mother of God are signified by her Immaculate Heart.

*Father Patrick*: As many of you are aware, Father Patrick is being treated for severe laryngitis. He has been advised very strongly by his physician to talk as little as possible until his vocal cords are completely healed. In fact, talking while he has this condition may cause permanent damage to his voice. Father Patrick wishes you to know that he is sorry that he is unable to greet you before and after liturgies, and wants you to understand why he has been limiting his contact with parishioners. He is anxious to get well and to be his usual dynamic self. He asks you to be patient until he is well again. Please pray for Father Patrick's speedy recovery.
