<u>JANUARY 8 - FEAST OF THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD</u>: Today, as Jesus is baptized, we have another epiphany (manifestation) or theophany (the revelation of God to humanity) when Jesus is named the Beloved Son of God. In actuality, Jesus had no need of the Sacrament of Baptism since he had no sin. However, in submitting himself humbly to his baptism by John the Baptist, Christ provided an example for all his followers. Jesus' baptism marks his initiation into public ministry. With this celebration we are called to recommit ourselves to follow in the footsteps of Jesus. Initiated into the Church through our baptism, we too are commissioned to proclaim Good News to the world by the way we live.

<u>ORDINARY TIME</u> (January 9 - February 13, 2024)

Ordinary Time encompasses that part of the liturgical year that does not fall within the distinctive seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter. The Catholic Church celebrates two periods of the year as Ordinary Time: the first following the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord and continuing until the Tuesday evening before Ash Wednesday; the second following Pentecost Sunday until the evening before Advent. There are about 33 or 34 Sundays in Ordinary Time, depending on the year. In actuality, however, there are fewer Sundays of Ordinary Time because major feasts honouring the Trinity, Corpus Christi, Christ the King, and others replace a particular Sunday of Ordinary Time. It is important to remember that Ordinary Time celebrates "the mystery of Christ in all its aspects".

JANUARY 12 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT MARGUERITE BOURGEOYS,

VIRGIN: Marguerite was born in France in 1620 and she made her first voyage across the Atlantic in 1653. Her mandate was to develop educational opportunities for the aboriginal children and for the families of the French settlers in Montreal. Other women eventually joined her, and the group formed an institute of uncloistered Sisters. Inspired by the life of Our Lady, the group chose the name 'Congrégation Notre-Dame'. Marguerite died in 1700 and was declared a saint in 1982. Her work continues today in many parts of the world through the efforts of the community which she founded.

January 13 - Memorial of Saint Hilary, Bishop, Doctor: Hilary was born in Gaul (France) in 320. As an adult, he converted to Christianity and was chosen as Bishop about 350. He is best known for his valiant defence of Christianity against the Arian heresy. He continued his confrontation with Arianism until his death about 368. He was proclaimed a Doctor of the Church in 1851.

SOLEMNITY OF THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

The word "epiphany" comes from the Greek noun "epiphaneia" which means "shining forth", "manifestation", or "revelation". There is great joy in the proclamation that God is made known to the entire world in Christ Jesus; on the other hand, this brings with it a great challenge for us to be open and accepting of others, to ensure that all people are welcome, and that all needs are met.
