.<u>July 13 - Memorial of Saint Henry:</u> Known as Henry the Good, Henry II (972-1024) was renowned as a just and clement ruler, a man of prayer, and a humble ascetic. He was canonized in 1146 by Pope Eugene III and is a patron of Benedictine oblates, childless people, dukes, kings, and the physically challenged.

July 14 - Memorial of Saint Camillus de Lellis, Priest: Camillus found his vocation in caring for the sick. Due to the horrific conditions in hospitals in the 16<sup>th</sup> century, he resolved to establish an order to care for the sick and dying. He was ordained and founded the nursing congregation of the Ministers of the Sick, the Camillians. He was canonized in 1746 and is a patron saint of nurses and of the sick.

#### JULY 15 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT BONAVENTURE, BISHOP,

**DOCTOR:** Born in Tuscany in 1221, Bonaventure joined the Friars Minor at age 20 and was sent to the University of Paris where he studied and then taught the philosophy and theology of the Franciscan school. In 1257 he was chosen minister general of the Franciscan Order, and in 1273 he was appointed a Cardinal by Pope Gregory X. He was known for his holiness, humility and virtue, and the dedication of his intellectual gifts to the service of the Church. His writings on Saint Francis, as well as on history, spirituality and medieval mystical doctrine, continue to inspire readers today. In 1482 he was canonized, and in 1588 he was declared a Doctor of the Church.

<u>July 16 – Memorial of Our Lady of Mount Carmel</u>: The Order of Carmel dates back to a group of Western hermits who in the  $12^{th}$  century settled on Mount Carmel, overlooking the plain of Galilee, in imitation of the prophet Elijah. They grouped themselves around a small chapel dedicated to Our Lady. In the  $13^{th}$  century, the Order of Carmel was formed, retaining the twin devotions of the early hermits: to Elijah and his solitary prayer, and to Our Lady under the title of ' Mount Carmel'.

**GOD GRANTS STRENGTH TO OUR WEAKNESS:** There are no difficulties, trials, or misunderstandings to fear, provided we remain united to God as branches to the vine, provided we do not lose our friendship with him, provided we make ever more room for him in our lives. This is especially so whenever we feel poor, weak, and sinful, because God grants strength to our weakness, riches to our poverty, conversion and forgiveness to our sinfulness.
