OCTOBER 24 - WORLD MISSION SUNDAY: At the initiative of Pope Pius XI in 1926, the second last Sunday of October became known as World Mission Sunday. On this day we are encouraged to deepen our realization that each of us shares in the mission of the Church and so should become more involved in today's missionary work. We are reminded that it is the responsibility of all Christian believers to spread the Gospel. Each Christian community is encouraged to "pray . . . so that the word of the Lord may spread rapidly and be glorified everywhere" (*2 Thessalonians 3.1*). We are invited also to give to the national collection for World Mission Sunday.

OCTOBER 28 - FEAST OF SAINT SIMON AND SAINT JUDE,

APOSTLES: The names of Simon and Jude appear in New Testament lists of the apostles. Simon the Zealot is thus named because of his zeal for the law. Jude (Judas) is often referred to as Thaddeus or the son (or the brother) of James to distinguish him from Judas Iscariot. Jude is also known as a patron saint of 'hopeless cases'. Both these Apostles suffered martyrdom.

Together, let's act for the planet and its defenders!

Development and Peace's annual *People and Planet First* campaign is inspired by the words of Pope Francis, who says that "a true ecological approach *always* becomes a social approach; it must integrate questions of justice in debates on the environment, so as to hear *both the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor*" (*Laudato Si'*, 49). These cries are too often silenced by powerful companies that plunder resources in countries of the Global South, without regard for people's fundamental human and environmental rights. Many such companies are Canadian.

Act to end their impunity now! <u>Sign the petition</u> asking the federal government to enact laws that will compel Canadian companies to conduct due diligence across their overseas operations and that will give the victims of their abuses access to justice in Canadian courts. Today's Gospel presents us with the story of Bartimaeus, the blind beggar, whose blindness is completely different from the blindness that inflicts so many who surround Jesus and are unable to see who Jesus really is. Though physically blind, Bartimaeus sees with the eyes of faith. He 'sees' Jesus 'true identity'; he 'sees' in Jesus someone who can heal him and continues to call out to the one he 'sees'. He 'sees' the possibility and grasps the opportunity, confident that Jesus will restore his sight. Ultimately, it is his encounter with Jesus that transforms his life and draws him closer as a follower. Like Bartimaeus, we too are called to see with the eyes of faith and confidently turn to Jesus when beset by problems and adversity, knowing that the Lord will help us. The healing of Bartimaeus also serves to remind us that Jesus is present in today's world, healing the world's blindness and leading the human family to see in him the truth of God's ways.
