**Vaccine Passport:** Effective October 22, 2021, it will be mandatory for all persons wishing to attend Masses or Services in our churches to demonstrate proof of vaccination by using the Vaccine Passport: NLVaxPass or by showing proof of vaccination by presenting their QR code before entering our churches. Therefore, beginning the weekend of October 23/ 2, entry into our churches be restricted to those who show proof of vaccination.

The Ministry of Health and Community Services has allowed for exceptions to this mandate. If, for pastoral reasons, it will be a burden for those attending to provide proof, then entry into our churches will be allowed with restrictions upon all attendees. For example, if at a funeral or wedding, persons who are necessary to the celebration cannot show proof of vaccination, then the celebration can go on with restrictions (see below).

To facilitate our compliance with the Mandate, two things are needed.

**1.)** Each person wishing to attend our celebrations must download their Electronic QR Code through the Vaccine Portal: <u>Vaccine Portal.</u> Then, after downloading their Electronic QR Code, they must download the app: NLVaxPass and add the Electronic QR Code to the app.

OR

Each person wishing to attend our celebrations must download their Electronic QR Code through the Vaccine Portal: <u>Vaccine Portal</u>. Then they must print out a copy and present it to the ushers before entering the church.

**2.)** Ushers or Greeters or other volunteers monitoring entrance to our churches must download the app: NLVaxVerify. This app will allow Ushers to use their smartphone camera to scan the Electronic QR Code on the attendee's smartphone or on the printed page to confirm proof of vaccination.

For the time being, all current restrictions presently in place will continue even for churches using the NLVaxPass and NLVaxVerify applications. As the Department of Health and Human Services monitors the increase or decrease of the spread of the disease, these restrictions will be reduced for churches using these applications. These restrictions are:

- Capacity is limited to 50 per cent;
- Everyone must wear a non- medical mask at all times( including the officiant and musicians);
- Congregational singing is not permitted;
- The names and contact information of all attendees must be recorded and retained for 14 days for contact tracing, and must be shared with public health officials if requested;
- Physical distancing must be maintained between individuals from different family groups;
- Entry must be restricted to only those who do not have COVID-19 symptoms and who are not required to self-isolate for any reason.
